Blessed Pauline von Mallinckrodt Beatified April 14, 1985

In School



In 1824, Detmar assumed his new responsibilities as Vice-President in the government of the Rhine Province. Aix-la-Chapelle (now Aachen), the old imperial city of Charlemagne, became Pauline's new home, the place, she recalled, "where I spent the happiest years of my youth." At the age of seven, her parents enrolled her at the private academy of Miss Ludger. All seemed to be going well for this bright, inquisitive student, until Pauline began to arrive late for school each day. Miss Ludger was puzzled and predictably provoked. Even more questionable than the little girl's tardiness was the appearance of her schoolbag—heavy and bulging. What would account for such a thing. An abrupt examination revealed the truth—pieces of broken glass! "Pauline, where in the world did you get all this glass?" demanded the principal. "I found it on the street. Poor children who don't have any shoes might hurt their feet," was the artless and innocent reply. Already a love for the poor was beginning to take shape in Pauline's heart at an age when most children do not yet realize that life is larger than their own little world. This incident seems to be a prelude to a lifetime of Christian love, a mission of charity that would span fifty-seven years of life and touch three continents.

Summer Bereavement Group

'Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.'

The parishes of St. Catharine, St. Gabriel and Our Lady of Mt. Carmel are jointly sponsoring a Bereavement Support Group which will meet on Tuesday mornings in the summer at St. Catharine in Glen Rock (905 So. Maple Avenue). You need not be a parishioner to attend. The group will meet from 10:00-11:30am in the Ministry Center and run for eight weeks beginning on July 7 and ending on August 25.

The intent of these meetings is to support one another during the beginning stages of the grief process. Only those people who are presently going through grief or have experienced loss can relate. Being a part of a grief group is a way of helping others which can contribute to our own healing. In this group, we stress confidentiality and mutual support. There are no "shoulds" in grief. We let others who have gone through the grief process help us understand and deal with our grief. We learn to lean into our pain. It cannot be outrun. We cannot go around it, over it, or under it. We need to go through it; we need to be good to ourselves, putting balance into our lives through prayer, reading, resting, relaxation and work. Grief takes time.
