

## from the Pastor

Today's readings show some biblical roots of what Christians would later call the Trinity. Proverbs showcases the role of Wisdom in the work of creation, portrayed as a reality outside of God but integrated into God's work of forming the heavens and the earth. We join the psalmist in sharing Wisdom's delight in God's handiwork: "O Lord, our God, how wonderful your name in all the earth." In his letter to the Romans, Paul writes of peace with God through Jesus, and the love of God received through the Holy Spirit, distinguishing God, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit while also displaying their abiding unity. Finally, in the farewell discourse from John's Gospel, Jesus, who had earlier spoken of himself as Son of the Father, promises his friends that they will receive the Spirit of truth that will teach and guide them after his departure.

## WHY DO CATHOLICS USE THE DIFFERENT TITLES WHEN WE ADDRESS THE CLERGY?

After Jesus ascended, the Church grew so quickly that the spiritual needs of the Christian community demanded a global hierarchy of clergy to minister to them while maintaining the unity of the Faith. In response, the Apostles ordained deacons to assist so they could focus on liturgy (Acts 6:2-4). Today there are different titles for different roles and levels of authority. For example, we are most likely to encounter priest ("Father"), deacons, and bishops ("Your Excellency," or "Your Grace").

## ST. BONIFACE

The Apostle of Germany, St. Boniface was a monk dedicated to spreading the Gospel in Germany. He converted many to Christianity and restored dioceses in Bavaria, Thuringia, and Franconia.

#### IS SIN REAL?

The world tells us that sin does not really exist and we should just try to be good people. Frankly, that isn't enough. Sin results when we don't follow God's laws. Dealing with sin is uncomfortable but the consequences are eternal.

God's rules rule. While we may think we are good and others may look up to us, eventually God will decide if we have been what he considers good. Since his opinion is the one that matters, his rules rule.

Sin is real. The world tells us that sin doesn't exist but Catholics know that "sin is deliberate thought, word, deed or omission contrary to the eternal law of God" (Catechism of the Catholic Church). The law can be found in the Ten Commandments, the Beatitudes and in Scripture. The law says sin is real.

**No guilt, no forgiveness**. Unconfessed sin separates us from God. "For you have hidden your face from us and have delivered us up to our guilt." (Isaiah 64:6) Avoiding guilt means losing God's forgiveness.

The plan. Each evening examine the day's actions and ask if they pleased God or not. Resolve to do better and take steps to change. Seek absolution through the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Then when you meet God he will say, "Well done, my good and faithful servant." (Matthew 25:23)

## CORPUS CHRISTI SUNDAY June 19

On this solemnity, we celebrate the transformation of the bread and wine into Jesus' Body and Blood in the Holy Eucharist. This solemnity was established by Pope Urban IV in 1264 in response to the need for a Eucharistic feast day.




