

Our readings today explore how faith begins and how faith works. Faith begins with God's initiative of love, together with God's promise about the future. The passage from Hebrews urges readers to have an assured confidence in God, who promised and delivered a lasting legacy to Abraham. The book of Wisdom reminds readers of the God who promised and delivered freedom from slavery during the Exodus. In the Gospel passage from Luke, Jesus begins with the promise that "your Father is pleased to give you the Kingdom," before describing how to live faithfully during times when God seems absent. God's promises mean that God is fully invested in our future. Living in these promises, we can confidently let go of fear and insecurity. We can anticipate that when God intervenes in our lives, it will be for our benefit. And we can become God's partners in fulfilling these divine promises.

THE KNIGHTS CORNER

The Knights of Columbus often greet each other with the



words "Vivat Jesus!" This Latin phrase, meaning "Jesus lives!" is also used at the end of written correspondence between Knights, in place of 'Regards' or 'Sincerely". The Knights have been using this phrase since the late '70s when a past Supreme Knight thought our Order ought to be devoted

to the name of Jesus.

<u>Did you know?</u> The response given when a Knight is greeted with the phrase "Vivat Jesus" is "Semper", meaning 'always'. As Pope Benedict XVI said in the homily at his installation Mass, "The Church is alive – she is alive because Christ is alive, because he is truly risen."

WHY DO CATHOLICS NEED GRACE

PRAY WITH ALL YOUR HEART



Even the most prayerful person falls upon dry periods in prayer. It can become routine, automatic or even feel like work. Yet prayer is lifting our hearts and minds to the one who loves us most. With that in mind, try altering your prayer routine.

Start with confession. It may seem unnecessary to confess sins to the one who sees our thoughts but prayerful confession breaks down barriers between us and God. When we are willing to hold back nothing from him, we can sincerely and humbly ask for forgiveness. Then we pray with a clean heart and a clear conscience.

SAINT OF THE WEEK St. Helena

Empress mother of Constantine the Great, St. Helena was a



native of Bithynia (a province of Rome, modern day central northern Turkey), who married the then Roman general Constantius I Chlorus about 270. Constantine was born soon after, and in 293, Constantius was made Caesar, or junior emperor. He divorced Helena to marry co-emperor Maximian's stepdaughter. Con-

stantine became emperor in 312 after the fateful victory at Milvian Bridge, and Helena was named August, or empress. She converted to Christianity and performed many acts of charity including building churches in Rome and in the Holy Land. On a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, Helena discovered the True Cross. She is believed to have died in Nicomedia. Her sarcophagus is in the Vatican Museum. In liturgical art, Helen is depicted as an empress, holding a cross.
