#### SAINT OF THE WEEK ST JEROME EMILIANI

For this purpose, he and some companions founded the Clerks Regulars of Somascha, in Somascha, Italy

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK St. Margaret of Hungary



St. Margaret of Hungary (1242–1271) was the daughter of King Bela IV of Hungary, and niece of the famed St. Elizabeth of Hungary. Her royal parents made a vow to God that if Hungary was saved from the Mongol

invasion, they would dedicate Margaret to religion. God heard their prayer and the country was saved. The king and queen then entrusted four-year-old Margaret to be raised and educated in a Dominican convent.

At the age of ten Margaret was transferred to the Convent of the Blessed Virgin founded by her parents, built on an island her parents named after her. Margaret spent the rest of her life there, dedicating herself to prayer and severe penances. She opposed her father's attempts to arrange her political marriage with the King of Bohemia, even though her suitor obtained a dispensation from the pope to release her from her religious vows so that she could enter into matrimony. Margaret made her solemn vows as a Dominican nun at the age of eighteen. Although a beautiful princess, she took the most menial tasks in the convent and dedicated her life to serving the poor and sick. She was considered a saint during her life and after her death. Many miracles, especially the curing of illnesses, were attributed to her intercession. She died at the age of 28.

#### WHY ARE WE ASKED TO PRAY THE ROSARY?



When Our Lady appeared at Fatima, Portugal, she asked that the Rosary be prayed for peace. As an immensely powerful prayer, the Rosary also has benefits for our:

Minds: Even on our busiest days, we need to spend time reflecting on Jesus. A whole Rosary takes a mere 20 minutes. The Rosary should be part of every day. Take breaks, pray for souls, receive graces.

**Hearts**: The Rosary is a Christ-centered, deeply Scriptural prayer. By meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary - important events in the life of Christ - we recall evidence of God's love in history. We can ask for the graces to imitate the virtues of Jesus and Mary. Gradually our hearts will be conformed to Jesus' Heart.
