

#### WELL PLACED FAITH

Our world is filled with pain, sorrow and suffering. Putting our faith in worldly powers guarantees disappointment. Putting faith in God guarantees that we will never be disappointed.

"Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace, according to thy word; for mine eyes have seen thy salvation which thou hast prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to thy people Israel." (Luke 2:29-32)

#### ST. JOHN BAPTIST DE ROSSI

Born in Voltaggio Italy, St. John Baptist de Rossi was born to devout middle class parents. Being an excellent student, he was invited to join the Roman College at the age of thirteen! Ten years later, John was ordained a priest. He spent his days serving prisoners, workers and the patients of the local hospitals, and his nights ministering to the poor people of the street. He died of illness worn out by his labors.

#### DEALING WITH DIFFUCULT PEOPLE JESUS' WAY

People who argue, fight, or refuse to cooperate can make our lives downright miserable. Yet, Jesus was masterful at dealing with difficult people. Following his example can save our sanity and our relationships.

Know when to ignore. When Jesus made his Nazareth friends and neighbors so mad that they wanted to throw him off a cliff, he knew there was no reasoning with them. "Passing through the midst of them he went away" (Luke 4:30). When people speak harshly or offensively, the best response can be to disengage and walk away.

Know when to say "no." Sometimes others demand more from us than we are able or willing to give, yet we give in out of guilt or fear of displeasure. Two of his best friends, James and John, said to Jesus, "we want you to do whatever we ask of you." (Mark 10:35. In response to this stunning breach of boundaries, Jesus was calm and firm. He said "no" and didn't make his loved ones happy.

Know when to stay calm. When Jesus took a Sabbath stroll with his friends (Matthew 12), Pharisees barged in and accused him of breaking the Sabbath. He remained calm and answered them peacefully. He wasn't afraid of being tripped up or trapped because he was unconcerned about others' opinions.

#### PLEASE FORGIVE ME!



Throughout history, there has been only one person who never made mistakes. The rest of us make plenty but few of us are comfortable with asking for forgiveness for them. Yet owning up to our mistakes is a big step toward preventing their recurrence. Try this:

Start by looking at the other person when you apologize. This communicates that you know you have caused harm and are ready to accept the consequences of your behavior.

Name the actions for which you are sorry. Be specific. Assure the other person that the actions won't happen again and detail the steps you will take to rectify any harm you caused. Remember true contrition involves making amends for your sin.

Give some visible sign that you are sincerely sorry. Shake hands or give a touch on the shoulder. Such an action will help start the healing of your relationship.

Taking steps to achieve sincere contrition and forgiveness will help you grow in holiness as you work to eliminate an occasion of sin.


