In this time of uncertainty, followers of Jesus know that worry is unnecessary. We know God wants us to experience these tips to help others lean on God:

Go deep into God's love. It is ours today, tomorrow, and forever. "...Good indeed is

the Lord, His mercy endures forever, his faithfulness lasts through every generation" (Psalm 100:5) Experiencing Sacraments, reading Scripture, and spending time in prayer are keys to growing in God's love and sharing it.

Share your confidence in God's care. Jesus promised that God will give us all we need, "Therefore, I tell you, do not be anxious about your life, what you shall eat or what you shall drink, nor about your body, what you shall put on ...your heavenly Father knows that you need them all." (Matthew 6:25, 32). Stress stems from the absence of certainty and control over our future. When we put ourselves in God's care, we can feel peace.

Demonstrate trust in God. While we may not be completely free from worry, St. Paul wrote, "Have no anxiety at all, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, make your requests known to God. 
