

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Marguerite Bourgeoys

Born at Troyes France in 1620, St. Marguerite consecrated herself to God and became a missionary. A friend introduced her to the mayor of Ville Marie (now Montreal) in Canada and on his invitation, she traveled to the New World to teach. With several others, she founded the Congregation of Notre-Dame de Montreal - a non-cloistered teaching order that was formally approved in 1676. By her death in 1700, she was called "Mother of the Colony."
